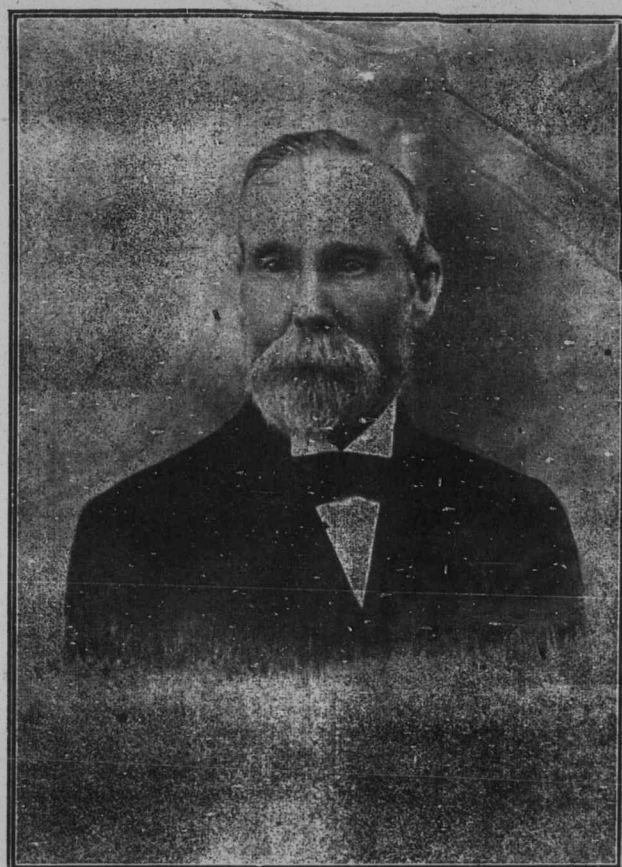

Harcourt, N. B., April 10—Geo. Walton, aged eighteen, son of Edward Walton, of Bass River, died this morning from injuries received yesterday while stream driving on the Richibucto River, ten miles from Harcourt. Starrak and Jones received only slight injuries, but Walton was hurt internally and passed away after twelve hours' suffering. Doctors Fairbanks and Girvan were in attendance. Mr. Walton, father of deceased, is business manager for the C. S. Hickman Lumber Co. The funeral will take place on Tuesday from Mr. Walton's home, Bass River.

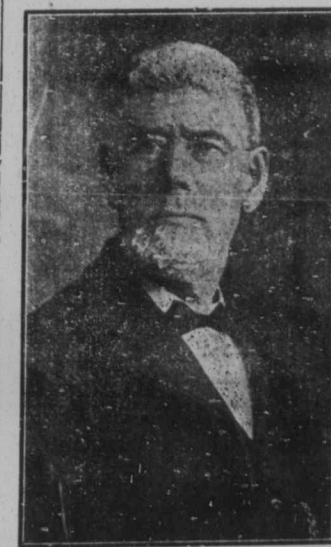
