TELEGRAPHIC.

HALIFAX, N.S., Oct. 9. Oct. 13—The Food Pit, Abigon Mines, Pictou, N.S., was suddenly flooded yesterday, and six men, including two managers, Fraser and Conway, were killed. Three hundred miners narrowly escaped. The republicans have carried the elections in Ohio and Indiana. The British continue sending war material to the Mediterranean. The Burmese threaten to invade British territory. King Thebau is insolent. Insurrection among the Mohammedans of Kashmir against the Chinese. Oct. 14—The Basutos have attacked and fired Mascara; great excitement in Cape Town. The Czars are ill. Archbishop McCabe has issued a powerful pastoral denouncing the Land League. Consternation prevails in Parnell party. The authorities have received information of an intended rising in the West of Ireland. The Khurds have destroyed 180 Persian villages. Russia prohibition against the export cereals is imminent. Oct. 15—The threatened occupation of Smyrna by the Powers caused the cessation of Duicigno. The religious excess have been ordered to be immediately executed throughout France. The Land League leaders is violent against Archbishop McCabe. The Government intends prosecuting the leaders. The Pope accepts Barcelona; Nina's resignation. Small-box and dysentery are rearing in Calcutta. The four prisoners suspected of the murder of Montmorres have been discharged. It is understood that the Government will prosecute the leaders of the Land League in the Court of Queen's Bench. The cessation of Duicigno has not yet been actually effected. The death of Cardinal Pecci is announced. Several Fenians have been arrested for conspiring to murder a landlord at Galenampdy. Thirteen Jesuits have been arrested at the college at Toulouse. The Cologne Cathedral was formally opened yesterday. The city was splendidly decorated. A short address was delivered in the Cathedral by Emperor William, and the German Standard was hoisted on the steeple. Oct. 18. A battalion of the Guards will be sent to reinforce the troops in Ireland. Hays ricks are being burnt by the Land Leaguers. A complete rupture has taken place between the Land Leagues and the Priesthood, owing to Archbishop McCabe's denunciations. Parnell yesterday urged persistence in agitation and organization. The North Western States have been visited by a severe snowstorm. The drifts are twelve feet deep and the rail ways are completely blocked. The French Government executed the Decrees on Saturday against the religious orders of Carmelites. It is expected that Earl Dufferin will succeed Gosen as Ambassador at Constantinople. No further naval proceedings are expected in Turkish waters. The French and German squadrons have been ordered home. Two commissioners have been appointed to superintend reforms in America. The Wigan strike has ended, the workmen having submitted to a reduction of 5 per cent. An Austrian dragoon has been murdered in Albania. Mr. Archibald Forbes lectures here on Tuesday and Wednesday. The President of the Republic of Paraguay is dead. An extensive fire took place on the cotton wharf in Charleston. Three British steamers, certain laden damaged. Prince Rudolph, of Austria, proposes an Austro-Russian alliance. Rumours have been received of Czar's impending abdication; the Czarevitch visits Livadia. The Sultan forbids the game of England to be mentioned in his presence; Kerbell Agha, attendant on Sultan, arrested, charged with attempt to fire palace.

The new French Shipping Company steamers to be built on Clyde. Cape troops have been defeated by Basutos. The Greeks are ready for war. Tekke Turcomans resumed hostilities against Russia. Lapy Montmorres is persecuted so persistently that she is compelled to leave the country. Cardinal Jacobini succeeds Cardinal Nina as Secretary to Pope. By a snow storm in Buenos Ayres a million and a half of cows, horses, and sheep perished.
