serious that has yet come under the notice of our authorities was brought to light last evening when the police arrested a young man who is charged with safe opening. When the start. ling facts of the case were made known matters were astir in police circles for little was it thought that a local "Jimmy Valentine" was at large in our midst. The accused is Mr. Best, aged 25 y e a r s, who was employed in the offce of the Horwood Lumber Co. as clerk for many years. For sometime past, in fact for months. the Company had been missing monefrom their combination safe in their office. This same safe had been there for years, the owners never altering the combination lock, as most firms do. However, none of the employees were suspected of having tampered with it. Best, as stated, was a long while working in the place and knew how to operate the combination perfectly. Periodically last year Best entered the office, it is alleged, in the absence of the other employees, opened he safe and took certain amounts. He carried on the robberies with tact as he never took beyond twenty odd dollars at a time and always managed to close the safe as if nothing had happened. After each visit that Best made the shortage would be discovered by the cash keeper, the employer would be acquainted but none of the employees would be acquainted about the matter. So far as could be ascertained in November last the sum of \$24.31 was taken and on the\_15th of December \$28.00 was missing. Mr. Horwood was at a loss to know how the monies were so mysteriously disarpearing. At last his suspicions became aroused and he was led to the belief that one of his office hands was operating. Mr. Horwood marked some of the notes that he put in the safe and took the numbers of them also. On Saturday night last Best again entered the building, paid his final visit to the safe and, as usual, got loot. Yesterday morning on opening the safe some of the marked notes were found missing. Mr. Horwood notified the police and told of the recent startling developments. Innector General Sullivan despatched tables Tobin and O'Neill on the ase. The officers dressed in plain and located Best, who was arsted on suspicion. In his vosseson were found the marked notes ith the description of those given Mr. Horwood and forthwith the olice came to the conclusion that the vstery had been solved and the rime brought home to the right perm.
