

expose for sale any condensed or evaporated milk containing less than eight per cent of milk fat. 2. The Medical Health Officer, Gov-

ernment Analyst, or any Inspector appointed for the purpose of the Inspection of Foods Act may enter any tore or any other place where any condensed or evaporated milk is kept or exposed for sale, and may take or purchase any reasonable sample of such condensed milk for the purpose of having the same analysed.

3. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale or expose for sale any ondensed or evaporated milk which is found on analysis by the Government Analyst to contain less than eight per cent of milk-fat shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars, or in default of payment, to imprisonment for a penot exceeding thirty days. 4. These Regulations shall come in
