Strike Settlement.**

Industrial outlook in Cape Breton is much brighter to-day as a result of the agreement between the company and the officials of the union.

The official statement of the terms of settlement says:

The men laid off recently at the Cape Breton Colliery shall be reinstated. The surface men recently laid off at the Princess Colliery shall be reinstated and underground workers at the Cape Breton Colliery shall be reinstated.

On Saturday, June 16, the management committee shall meet to discuss the Princess situation, both surface and underground.

In view of the fact that work on the Cape Breton Colliery is coming to a halt, the management committee shall consider the question of the distribution of the labor affected by the strike.

As soon as the Princess case is settled, the committee from Cape Breton shall meet the management committee of the labor organization at Sydney, and adjust any instances that may be found in the organization there.

The management committee shall understand the real case of the 24 hour men of North Cape Breton miners and shall not be placed back at their work.

On Saturday, June 16, the management committee shall meet to discuss the Princess situation, both surface and underground.

In view of the fact that work on the Cape Breton Colliery is coming to a halt, the management committee shall consider the question of the distribution of the labor affected by the strike.

As soon as the Princess case is settled, the committee from Cape Breton shall meet the management committee of the labor organization at Sydney, and adjust any instances that may be found in the organization there.

The company's statement, as given by the Canadian Press, says, "The employees have returned to work and the result of a misunderstanding which has been satisfactorily explained. The employees, whose resignation was objected to, have been reinstated in some instances at their own work, and in other instances at a production character."

It is understood that the union is not opposed to the reinstatement and to transfer of men to non-productive work to production.


