Is 1862 what was known as the "Wicked Bible" was printed and issued. It dewed its, title from the fact that the word "not" was accidentally omitted from the seventh commandment by one of the intelligent compositors of that period, and an act of Parliament ordered the destruction of the whole edition.

Its simplicity, conciseness and strength put, if into the very fore front of the battle between Western civilization and the sleepy empire of the East. Wherever English capital goes, there goes withit the language—agressive, dominant and unyielding. Japan is about to adopt it as a national language; it is rapidly spreading through India; it is calling pretty loudly at the closed doors of China; it is sinking along the shores and around the islands of Polynesia. Australia is connected with Europe by an English speaking wire, and the islands of the East Indies are feeling the influence of this resistless tide.


