

OLD LONDON'S VOLUNTEERS

Reception Postponed Until
Monday.

Expectant Crowds Swarmed the Streets to See the South African Heroes—Plot to Assassinate the French Premier.

LONDON'S GALA DAY POSTPONED.
London, Oct. 27.—The celebration upon the occasion of the return to England of the City of London Imperial Volunteers has been postponed until Monday, on account of the lateness of the arrival of the steamship *Aurovia*, which has the troops on board. The vessel cannot dock at Southampton until late this afternoon. By 10:30 o'clock this morning, however, the streets of London were swarming with expectant crowds, who were ignorant of the postponement.

RUSSIA'S GRAIN SHORTAGE.
St. Petersburg, Oct. 27.—According to the Official Messenger, the grain short-

age is not confined to the eastern provinces and Siberia. The provinces richest in cereals are actually suffering on account of poor harvests. Grain is forwarded ahead of other merchandise, and grain railroad rates have been reduced.

PLOT TO KILL PRESIDENT LOUBET.
Lyons, Oct. 27.—The Nouv. Eclaireur de Lyon says a plot to assassinate President Loubet has been discovered. It appears that a working electrician

named Couturier entered the electric company's premises at Nimes and stole 2,500 francs. He was tracked to

Orange, near Lyons, where he was arrested. Documents found on his person revealed, the paper says, an anarchist conspiracy to assassinate President Loubet on his coming visit to Lyons to unveil a monument erected to the memory of President Carnot.
