TENSION AT TEHERAN

British Government Says It Existed Between Shuster and Ministry.

[By Canadian Press.] London, Dec. 4.—The position of W. Morgan Shuster, in Persia, came up in the House of Commons yesterday. Francis Dyke Ackland, under secretary of foreign affairs, said in reply to a question that the British minister at Teheran had some time ago reported that severe tension existed between the Persian ministers and Shuster. This lasted for some weeks and caused the resignation of three cabinet ministers. Recently, however, he had received no information regarding the feeling among the Persian people, but Mr. Shuster's work had the support of the national council.

HORSE SHIED AT ENGINE AND JUMPED INTO FENCE

Animal Was Badly Injured and Owner Shaken Up On Proof Line Road.

Mr. Ed Douglas, a farmer living near Hilderton, had a very valuable horse terribly shaken up on Saturday, when, as he was driving home on the Proof Line road, his horse shied at a traction engine and jumped into a fence.

The manner in which it plunged hurled the buggy with Mr. Douglas against the fence, with such force that the front axle was smashed and the vehicle wrecked.
