Waterloo County Has Paid \$41,878 As A War Tax

The County Treasurer, Mr. H. J. Bowman reports that the County taxes, including the Provincial war tax, have all been paid promptly this year. The war tax is one mill on the assessment and this is the first time the Province has levied a tax on the various municipalities.

The war tax totals \$31,888 for which a cheque has already been forwarded to the Provincial Treasurer. The various municipalities contributed as follows:—Waterloo Tp. \$4,911; Wilmore \$3,473; N. Dumfries \$2,128; Town of Galt \$6,258; Waterloo \$2,994; Preston \$2,720; Hespeler \$1,250; Village of New Hamburg \$675; Ayr \$250; Elmira \$700.
