

League, said: "While we continue to
believe that free trade is the best and
wisest policy for this country, we can
all see that the virtues and results which
were expected to follow free trade have were expected to follow free trade have not been realized, and the propriety of its universal adoption has been falsified. Yet the Cobdenites still seek to persuade us that it is best that Great Britain bould be the only free trade control. us that it is best that Great Britain should be the only free trade country in the world. During the last fifty years we have learned by painful experience that neither old nor new markets are opening to us by the influence of free trade alone, and that if we want to proide the increasing commerce necessary for the support of our increasing population we must find those markets ourselves, and not neglect the opportunity of expanding and consolidating the col-
