NOVEMBER ELECTIONS.

Democratic Gains in New York—Republican
Success in Massachusetts.

Yesterday state officers were elected in
Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Mis-
sissippi, Nebraska, New York, Pennsyl-
vania, Virginia and Wisconsin; but only in
Massachusetts, Minnesota, Mississippi, Vir-
ginia and Wisconsin were governors chosen.
