Death of Police Headquarters.

Just before noon yesterday, Policeman Peckham found a man lying in an unconscious condition in the Esplanade at the foot of Bay street.

The man was taken to police headquarters, where he died shortly after his arrival. The sweatsman had been called, but was too late to do anything.

Coroner Peckham held an inquest at the morgue last night. A young man named Charles H. Macmillan, 36 years of age, was identified as the deceased.

Macmillan, who worked for the past six months at Wm. Thomson's, shoe uppers, 46 Adelaide street east. Dr. Swetnam testified that death resulted from kidney and stomach disease, accelerated by cardiac ailment. A verdict accordingly was entered. Deceased was a widower, but no one seemed to know where he lived.

The result of yesterday's trial was therefore no surprise, the key acquittal having been expected.
