DANCING GIRL'S DEATH

ne of the Members of the Troupe of Now Performing at the Musee Dies Suddenly From a Hereditary Disease-

Haka Suzuki, aged 16, a member of the Japanese troupe of dancing girls which has been performing at the Musee this week, died suddenly at St. Michael's Hospital last

evening.
Miss Suzuki was taken ill on Tuesday, when she complained of nausea, and it was supposed she was suffering from the prevailing epidemic, and was treated for such.

Yesterday morning she became much worse, and she was taken to St. Michael's Hospital, where she died at 10 o'clock last

night.

It was supposed that she was suffering from kakka, a Japanese hereditary disease which has baffled physicians for years. Dr. Dwyer conducted a post-mortem and discovered a tumor which had been growing on the brain for some time. The disease is hereditary, both of her parents having died of the same malady.

The girl was brought from Osaka, Japan, with her companions, by Manager Herati, the company having been organized by a joint stock company in the land of the Mikado for performances at the World's Fair.

Fair. The funeral will take place on Sunday next to St. Michael's Cemetery, it being impossible to send the body home for interment. However, a portion of the dead girl's hair and some of her clothes will be sent to relatives on the banks of the Yodogawa, and the native funeral will be held in the Sunrise Kingdom.
