War on the Livery Companies.

The scheme of completing the unification of London by the absorption of the city has greatly frightened the corporations called livery companies. The progressists in the County Council are about to petition to the Government to give immediate effect to this reform. The debate in the School Board last Thursday elicited wholesale depunciation of the city companies which nunciation of the city companies which are plundering the public of funds which pught to be devoted to education. The giscussion partially disclosed how the money was spent. Out of a gross income of £800,000 a year the bulk is expended in the administration of sincure posts, involving the payment of mormous salaries to useless officials, and property of £100,000 yearly is spent. and upwards of £100,000 yearly is spent in eating and drinking.
