NEW-BRUNSWICK. PROVISIONAL PARLIAMENT.

RAILWAY DEBATE CONCLUDED.—We copy the following pleasing intelligence, from a Telegraph Dispatch to the New-Brunswick.

The great debate on the Railway was brought to a close last evening, and in such a manner as must be deemed satisfactory to every friend of progress and advancement. The Resolutions introduced by the Government in favour of the line, have been carried by large majorities.
