The Hants Journal says: "We have with us to record the death of Rev. J. Bassett, at Watford, on Friday last, in the 80th year of his age. This well-known and esteemed Baptist clergyman was born in Annapolis county, but has resided in Hants county for upwards of twenty years, preaching first at Newport, and afterwards at Watford, where he has been stationed some ten or twelve years. Owing to advanced age he left the active work of the ministry several years ago and to farming, his position as pastor being filled by the Rev. Mr. Freeman. He was a devoted and active worker, and faithful pastor. His first wife was a Miss Starratt, of Annapolis, by whom he had three sons and one daughter. His second wife, who survives him, was a sister of Mrs. Isaac Dimock, of Windsor, by whom he had one son, Earnest, who was married a few months ago to Miss May Mother. The aged father, it will be remembered, assisted at the ceremony in the Baptist church. His son Edwin, who drives the mail from Watford to Newport daily, lives on a part of his late father's farm. The funeral took place on Sunday morning, June 23rd, at the residence of the house and grave were conducted by the Rev. Geo. Weather, of Summersville. The obsequies were attended by a very large gathering of friends and acquaintances in various sections of the county, several being present from Windsor.

A DEED ON THE STREET.—Colby, N. S., June 20.—Dr. Wm. W. Ray and Frank H. Watson fought their way with revolvers in the principal street in Colby at 6 last evening. Both are prominent and moved in the best circles. They are first cousins, and recently had a misunderstanding about personal matters. Both are wounded, but not dangerously.

THE CHOLERA IN SPAIN.—Madrid, June 20.—Government cholera commission, sent to Province of Castile, arrived at the infected town of Puente de Ruyat. They are convinced that the cholera prevalent there is the Asiatic, but it is localized, and is decreasing. The commission reports having found 80 cases of cholera, of which 20 were pronounced to have been two more deaths. Two cases of the disease were found at Bergamin.

THE CRIME OF THE WEEK.—A murder case is at an end and the prisoner has left the court, as Judge Meagher expressed it, "without a stain upon his character." The crown prosecutor, C. J. McDonald, told the jury he had no evidence to present before them, and the jury, without leaving their box, unanimously rendered a verdict of "not guilty." Judge Meagher in the severest terms commended W. F. Best, analyst, who conducted the trial, and the defence was conducted by H. M. D. Heary, Q. C., Sinclair and McLean, of the bar.

A SHOCKING DEATH.—The entire community was shocked yesterday by the announcement that Dr. William Gray had been found dead on the road leading from the Vale colliery. The doctor left home Friday morning and did not reach home until Saturday morning when a number of his friends went to search for him. They discovered his body in a shallow grave, and shortly after discovered the body of a hundred yards distant. The doctor was found with a bullet wound in the head, and a verdict of death from natural causes was returned. The doctor was troubled with heart disease and endeavored to keep himself clear of all exciting subjects, but it is thought that death is traceable to worry and excitement consequent on the McLeod poisoning case. Dr. Fraser, who was a warm friend of the doctor, and his sudden death caused a shock to the whole community.

A NARROW MAJORITY.—London, June 20.—In the commons yesterday afternoon, the house having been opened on the Licensing bill, the chairman moved that the first clause, applying £250,000 to purchase the licenses, stand as part of the bill. A division was taken and the clause was carried by the narrow majority of four, the vote being 228 to 224. The conservatives cheered the result, but their cheers were drowned by the triumphant shouts of the opposition over the narrow escape of the government. Scheme of the opposition to purchase a vote while the conservatives benches were sparsely occupied, completely surprised the ministers, who greatly feared defeat.

Mr. Editor.—During the past winter, through the efforts of gentlemen learned in the law, we doubtless with regard to the legality of the Scott Act, so far as it relates to this County, have been entertained, and have rendered the law inoperatively, although the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia has failed to give a decision as yet on the case argued before it in March last, which would settle this matter in doubt. The Hon. Mr. Justice, of the Supreme Court, has declared by special Act of Parliament that the Scott Act is in full force and effect, and the Minister of Justice took the occasion to administer a severe reprimand to the judge who countenanced the doubt that he had spoken.

At the April Session of the Municipal Council resolutions from nearly all the temperance societies in the county were presented asking for the continuance of the Inspector in office. The Council agreed to this by a unanimous vote, but the summer is passing away and not a single complaint has been entered. Why is this? Have the violators of the law died or gone to the States? I wish I could believe this. Many good men would like to throw all the responsibility of enforcing the law on some one else and ask like Cain, "Am I my brother's keeper?" Some day they may wake up and find their own children and daughters bit by the serpent. No person who loves his country, then every person who loves his neighbor, and his own hearth and home, should, as soon as he has proof of the violation of the law, place the evidence in the Inspector's hands, and appear in the witness box. A PECULIAR LAWSUIT.—Boston, June 20.—The full bench of the supreme court has just rendered an opinion in the case of Louis O. Morse vs. Ely Brodhead, which was tried in Worcester county. The plaintiff is practicing physician in Southbridge, and the defendant is pastor of the parish of Notre Dame, in that town. The action was for the sum of \$2,000, which was paid by the defendant in the church, in consequence of the second marriage of the plaintiff, who was the wife of the defendant. Among other things that the priest said was "If any of you are sick and want my assistance, you shall have it, for I am of this persuasion in this, because I will not under the same roof with him. The plaintiff foundered the suit, and the defendant had caused him great injury and loss of practice. The jury in the lower court found for the plaintiff \$1,500, and the supreme court having overruled the defendant's exceptions, the amount with costs and interest of \$2,000, will have to be paid.
