SEALED TENDERS, addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tender for Timber for Lock Gates," will be received at this office until the arrival of the Eastern and Western mails, on THURSDAY, the 17th day of May next, for the furnishing and delivering, on or before the 1st day of October, 1882, of Oak and Pine Timber, sawn to the dimensions required for the construction of Lock Gates for the new Lock at Greece's Point, Crerwell Canal, and the new Lock at St. Anne's, Ottawa River. The timber must be of the qualities specified, and of the dimensions stated on a printed bill which will be supplied on application, personally or by letter, at this office, where forms of tender can also be obtained. No payment will be made on the timber until it has been delivered at the place required on the respective canals, nor until it has been examined and approved by an officer detailed to that service. Contractors are requested to bear in mind that an accepted bank cheque for the sum of \$500 must accompany each tender, which shall be forfeited if the party tendering declines to enter into a contract for supplying the timber at the rates and on the terms stated in the offer submitted. TELEGRAPH LINES. SELKIRK TO EDMONTON.

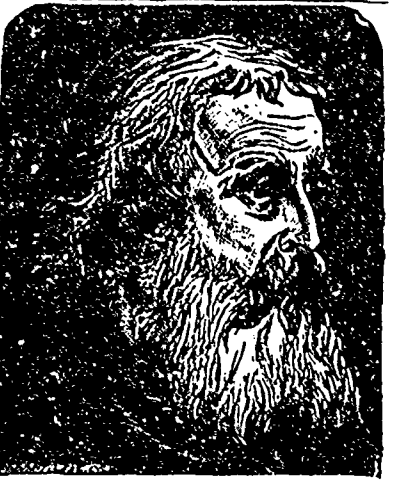
