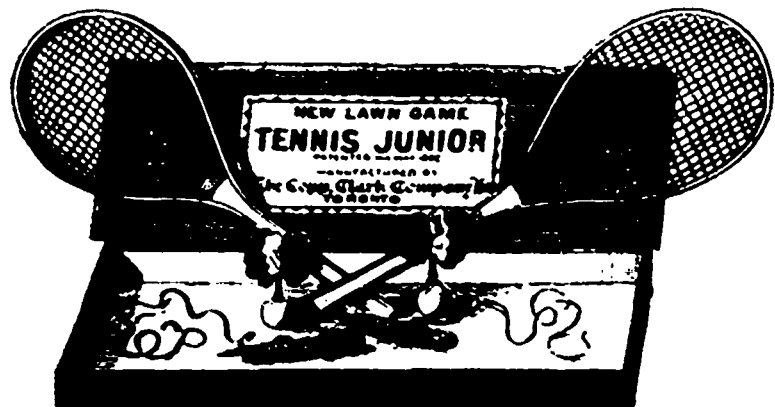
GEORGE MOORE'S LATEST.

All Great Britain got excited over George Moore's latest novel, "Esther Waters," because one firm of newsdealers refused to handle it. Then the critics went at the book, and Conan Doyle, Sir Frederick Pollock, Sarah Grand and others all agreed that the book was not immoral, and was fit and proper reading for the English public. A 50c. American edition is now offered to the Canadian public, and 25c. ones may be expected to follow.

Esther Waters was a child of poverty, and was early put into service. Her master was an owner of race horses, and consequently part of the book is very turf. Esther grows up in the big kitchen and finally has a lover, the squire's footman. They are to be married, until one night out for a stroll after a beer celebration in the kitchen, Esther loses her purity. Next day she is righteously indignant, drives her William from her and lives a life of penance. Soon she leaves her place and goes to London, where her pangs of motherhood are intensified by the pangs of poverty. Her long struggle to raise her baby boy to manhood is touching and pathetic.

The author is a careful writer, strong in delineating his characters, and realistic in his description of poverty and sin. He tells plain truth, but in a garb of artistic conception, lofty language, and poetic imagination. He has apparently seen the sufferings of the poor, the degraded and the outcast, and has been stirred to write on their behalf. To Canadians, at least, the story of the English poor of London and surrounding villages will be somewhat of a revelation.
