CIDA's Industrial Co-operation Program provides financial contributions to Canadian firms wanting to participate in sustainable development through long-term co-operation with local partners in developing countries. In 1994-95, the program disbursed \$8.3 million to support projects in China.

In November 1994, Prime Minister Chrétien and Chinese Premier Li Peng signed letters of intent for six development co-operation projects that support Chinese administrative, legal and economic reforms. The six are the: Statistical Information Management Project, Public Policy Options Research Project, Women in Development — Xinjiang, Women's Law Program, Special University Linkage Consolidation Program and Senior Judges Training Centre Project.
