PRAYERS.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Ninth Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the Petition presented on the 15th instant, and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with in this case. The said Petition was then read and received, and is as follows:—

Of Lucille Margaret Turbin Kelly, of Montreal, Quebec; praying for the passing of an Act to declare her marriage with George Douglas Kelly, of Montreal, Quebec, to be dissolved, and that she be divorced from him.—*Mr. Vallance.*

And also,—Return to an Order of the House of the 31st January, 1934, for a copy of all declarations, affidavits, telegrams and other correspondence, in connection with the dismissal of Grégoire Lafrance, of Pointe Basse, Iles de la Madeleine, as watchman of the lighthouse at l'Echourie, Iles de la Madeleine, and also relative to the appointment of his successor.

Mr. Dupré, a Member of the King's Privy Council, for Mr. Sauvé, presented,—Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, of the 5th February, 1934, for a copy of all correspondence, recommendations, reports, orders in council, in connection with the appointment of Mr. Jean Bruchési, of Montreal, to a position in the Post Office Department.
