

band-aid or an aspirin. On the contrary, the government, without ignoring the most underprivileged Canadians, has seen fit to come to grips with the real basic causes of the destructive ailment which is inflation. The budget is an outstanding example of the will of the government to put up a strong fight against inflation, the major impediment to the sustained and constant improvement and development of growth, employment and the standard of living.

By drastically reducing its deficit and cash requirements through higher revenues and stricter controls over spending, the government reinforces and consolidates its determination to fight inflation. The direct aftermath of that policy will be to contribute as well to lower the interest rates for the greatest benefit of all Canadians.
