PRAYERS.

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate doth concur in the amendments made by the House of Commons to the Bill No. 174 (Letter H5 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to incorporate The Detroit and Windsor Subway Company."

Also,—A Message informing this House that the Senate had passed the following Bill, without any amendment:—

Bill No. 189, An Act to provide for a loan to the Harbour Commissioners of Montreal.

Sir Henry Drayton, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House the following Orders in Council:—

P.C. 1042, dated 29th June, 1926, appointing the Right Honourable Arthur Meighen, a Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada, to be Secretary of State for External Affairs and President of the Privy Council.

P.C. 1043, dated 29th June, 1926, appointing Mr. William Anderson Black a Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada.

P.C. 1044, dated 29th June, 1926, appointing the Honourable Sir Henry L. Drayton, a Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada, to be Acting Minister of Finance and Acting Minister of Railways and Canals.

P.C. 1045, dated 29th June, 1926, appointing the Honourable Hugh Guthrie, a Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada, to be Acting Minister of Justice and Acting Minister of National Defence.

P.C. 1046, dated 29th June, 1926, appointing the Honourable Henry Herbert Stevens, a Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada, to be Acting Minister of Agriculture, Trade and Commerce, Customs and Excise and Interior and Acting Superintendent General of Indian Affairs and Acting Minister of Mines.

P.C. 1047, dated 29th June, 1926, appointing the Honourable R. J. Manion, a Member of the King's Privy Council for Canada, to be Acting Minister of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, and Acting Minister in charge of the Depart-
