Your Committee have examined the following Petitions, and find that sufficient notice has been given in each case:—

Of the Atlantic and North-West Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act extending the time for the completion of their line of Railway, and for other purposes.

Of W. C. Van Horne, and others, provisional Directors of the St. Lawrence and Atlantic Junction Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act extending the time for the commencement and completion of their proposed Railway.

Of the Honorable Herbert E. Wilson, and others, of Edmonton and elsewhere; praying to be incorporated as The Assiniboia, Edmonton and Unijiga Railway Company.

Of John Hoskin, and others; praying to be incorporated as The Assets and Debenture Company of Canada.

Of James H. Ashdown, and others, of the City of Winnipeg; praying to be incorporated as The Assiniboine Water Company.
