Let the fruit just get hot, and then add a pound and a half of preserving sugar, a sprinkling of ground cinnamon, and a teaspoonful of fresh butter. Stir until the jam begins to thicken, and pot while steam-

APPLE AND TOMATO JAM.

Wipe five pounds of apples with a clean, damp cloth, and cut them into quarters. Do not peel them. Put them in a preserving pan, and barely cover with cold water. Simmer until they are quite soft and strain thru cheese muslin. Put some tomatoes into builing water for Put some tomatoes into boiling water for one minute, and then take them out and skin them. Slice them thinly. Add the sliced tomatoes to the apple liquid and weigh. To every pound of liquid and tomatoes put a pound of preserving sugar. Then color with a little cochineal. Simmer until a little of the jam put on a saucer gets firm. Pot while hot.
