fell feveral showers of small rain, attended with frequent thick fogs. At nine, our longitude being nearly 186 deg. 18 min. E. we saw land, being part of the continent of Asia, bearing from S. S. W. to S.W. our foundings at this time were twenty-three fathoms, with a fandy bottom. At noon, our latitude by account was 68 deg. 46 min. N. when the extremes of the land bore from S. 55 deg. E. five miles distant, to N. S5 deg. W. three leagues distant, the nearest part bearing S. by W. about two miles, our foundings being eight fathom. We foon after tacked, and flood to the N. N. E. the wind N. W. The land to the eastward was low and level, that behind it moderately high, with little or no fnow, but the whole as barren as can well be conceived: we did not observe the least ice upon or near the shore. At two we tacked and flood W. S. W. W. At four we had showers of small rain, our foundings were fifteen, and at five twelve fathom,
