found, as well in the Holy Scriptures as in heathen writers, acknowledging and proving the interpolition of Providence; both to punith and reward the nations of the earth according to their deeds. Nor can it be neceffary : For this is a truth which the general confent of mankind hath admitted. Excepting only a few profellors of Science fally fo called, who would attribute the whole to fecond caufes : Not confidering how many of the transactions alluded to no human fagacity could, on this fuppolition, unravel : And, moreover, that whether God works his purpole by a fecond, a third, or a fourth caufe, it is equally God that works all the while. But fuch men look only to the inftrument : To them the arm of the Lord that wields it hath not been revealed.

But let us, my Brethren, cultivare more humble and devout difpolitions. Let us endeavour to improve by the awful judgments that have fallen on paft ages. But particularly let us firive to difern the Signs of these present times, that we may flee from the wrath to come. For this purpose we shall now proceed

2. To confider whether there be not now evident marks of a divine vifitation in the world.

Under this head I do not mean to dwell, (for time will not permit) on that fpirit of difcontent and turbulence; that defire of unfettling ancient habits; that difpolition to quit the flow but fure ways of fober induffry, and to rufh into new adventures—which are in themfelves curfes of no light nature and infallibly lead to others tenfold more fevere; and which, notwithftanding, now feem to have infected a confiderable part of mankind. But I will only draw your attention to the prefent miferable fituation of France—A country whole defperate attack on our deareft rights might well provoke us, but whole exceflive fufferings are enough to draw compafion from the bittereft enemies it ever had.

The people, of whom I (peak, were but lately, as a nation, very flourithing and powerful; but they had amongft them many crying abufes and corruptions : And it may not be altogether ufelefs to notice a few of the principal ones; that we may fee how naturally (fuch is the wife appointment of God) their fufferings have grown out of their fins.

In the first place, then, the established religion of the country was deformed by many and grievous errors; and their public worship was superstitious and absurd in the extreme.
