

SCHULTZ, HENRY. *An Essay on Aquatic Rights intended as an illustration of the Law relative to Fishing and to the Propriety of Ground or Soil produced by Alluvion and Dereliction in the Seas and Rivers.* Philadelphia, 1839; 8°.

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NOTE.—In the arid states, Federal legislation has modified, and State and Territorial legislation has modified or abolished, the legal doctrine of "riparian rights" substituting for it the doctrine of "appropriation" as the basis of rights in running water. This legal treatise, after a brief historical sketch of this change, summarizes these laws, and the decisions of the Federal and State courts interpreting them.
