Flour Standards Fixed. The Flour Board appointed to fix standards are through with their labors. The only important enange is in Ontario straight rollers. Hereafter Manthoba wheat will not be allowed to be mixed with Ontario wheat in making this grade. The flour will be made of two-thirds red and one-third white Ontario wheat. One reason for this change is said to be that Manitoba wheat this year is 20 cents a bushel higher than Ontario wheat, and that the introduction of Manitoba wheat into straight roller flour would mean an increase in the cost of the latter article. The Manitoba flour standards this year will be about the same as last.
