CATTLE SELL OFF IN EASIER MARKET

All Small Meats Are Holding Steady.

With a run of cattle in the neighborhood of 3500 head on the Union Yards yesterday, the demand for the better class of butchers, heavy weight steers and heifers was probably a shade easier, but with straight loads of cattle selling at 25c in two or three cases 25.50 per cent, there was mighty little to be done. The demand keeps consistently good, but the tone was undoubtedly easier on the lighter and comparatively ill-finished lots. Probably from 150 to 250 per cent, would indicate the difference. There were some who thought the decline was more marked, and in some cases this was so, and in others the higher bunches held. Most of the commission houses report a fair good clean up and said they were well satisfied with the day's business.
