**THIS CENSUS BY RELIGION GIVES HAMILTON SOME PRIDE**  
Of a Population of 58,172, There Are 26,000 Who Don't Go to Church.

Hamilton, Jan. 12.—(Special.)—The religious census just taken furnishes some interesting information. The Sunday school workers who claim to have visited every house found that the population of the city was 58,172. The assessors made it 57,563 in their returns last October. Of the 58,172 residents of the city, 25,985 never enter a church, and 52,187 attend church. The 26,000 who do not go to church cannot claim that it is because they have not a sufficient choice of churches, for there are less than thirty-two different religious sects in the city. In addition to the more common religious bodies, the canvassers found the following: Church of God, Free Methodists, Latter Day Saints, Moravian, Millennium of Dawn, Baptist, Seventh Day Adventists, Universalists, Society of Friends, Greek Catholic Armenians, Christians, Salvationists, Spiritualists. There are 1728 families, or about 8830 people who have not been heard from yet, but from the returns it is dated the Presbyterians are in the lead, with the Methodists a close second. The figures are: Free by 11,876; Baptists, 10,383; Roman Catholics, 7819; Baptists, 3449;



**FIRE DRILL ONCE AGAIN SAVES PUPILS IN PERIL**

Phoebe St. School Badly Damaged by Fire, But 625 Children Marched Cheerily Out.

Nothing was wrong there. He said there had been complaints during the morning of insufficient heat.

The fact that three rather heavy losses through school fires have occurred in Hamilton within a year is not causing any uneasiness among insurance companies as to this particular class of risks. It is, however, a matter worth looking upon, the rate allowed schools is too low. The schedule calls for fire for three years, which can be secured very much below what a factory and general mercantile building are called upon to pay. In fact, it is placed on the level of house insurance, which commonly requires five on the structure itself and six upon the contents. This, however, is not a fair rank as first-class risks, despite their peculiar construction with wide stairs and passageways and high ceilings, which lend themselves to draughts, and naturally add to fan into activity an incipient blaze. The absence of combustible material, and, indeed, the scarcity of fuel of any kind to feed the flames is a noteworthy consideration in fixing the low rate applied.

One result of the Phoebe-street school fire, it is estimated, may be the destruction of an 80-cent insurance rate by companies, but this is only being talked of in certain quarters and may not go further. There is \$11,000 insurance on the building and \$1600 on the contents. Some 44 companies are involved, the individual loss will be trifling.

**Discussed by trustees.**
