Note.—This amount, together with probable grants to increase the salary of Clergy to \$600, will make the Society's responsibility for missionary purposes \$3200. The probable income during 1865 for general purposes will be \$3700, which after deducting the necessary contingencies will leave but a small margin for grants toward building Parsonages or Churches.

Jany. 20, 1865.—\$40 was granted toward the enlargement of the Church at "Church Over," Parish of Shelburne.
