## BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The Convener stated that he had corresponded with Rev. R. ## LAKE SUPERIOR.

The Committee considered at length the present condition and future prospects of the Lake Superior fields.

## I. SILVER ISLET.

The Convener reported that Mr. Hamilton, Licentiate, who succeeded Mr. Caswell at this station, had done good service; but that, owing to the large majority of the population having left the place, the mine not being worked as formerly, the people were not able to contribute anything beyond the expense of board to the support of the Missionary.
