ST. JOHNS DOWNED MONCTON

The Trojans of the Railway City Defeated in a Good Game on the Victoria Grounds Yesterday Afternoon by a Score of Ten to Six--Twas Fast Baseball--Another Game Today.

Those who were present at the baseball game between the Trojans of Moncton and the St. John's yesterday afternoon, were treated to a contest brimming over with exciting incidents and characterized by some phenomenal plays.

At three o'clock "Pete" McAllister walked out on the diamond and in a short time the battle was raging.

The lineup of each team was as follows:

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The Monctonians went first to bat, and it was quite evident that there was a great many of the railway town "gods" among the rosters.

Inning No. 1--Weir hit to McGuigan and Britt helped him hit. McGuigan sent the sphere to left garden for two bases. E. Baler sent a long drive between deep right and centre, but Cregan jumped and captured the leather with the left hand. This was undoubtedly a great catch, and started the rosters. McGuigan tried to get a line on third, but was nabbed in the act.

For the St. John's Cregan hit to short and died before reaching the initial base. McGuigan walked on for wide ones. Britt drove a long fly to centre, but Baler seemed "to have a feeling" for left field and just got over in time to touch it. McGuigan completed the circuit on the hit. Dan then stole third gracefully.

Long drove his ever timely two base hit to the club house, and Britt galloped home. Burke hit to third and Long went to tripping bag. Breen went out on a fly to left. Score--St. John 2, Moncton 0.

Inning No. 2--"Ned" Ember (our friend) swatted the leather between centre and right for two bases, and was given the glad hand. Finnmore hit to first and Britt was gathering it up when "Ned" stood on the base, Ember going from third. G. Baler hit to short and went out. Burns fled to Britt and Melish landed one to "Volcano" in centre.

The winter port boys then took the stick. Harris hit to left. Mills fouled to Ember and the latter threw subsequently to first. In the mid-air Harris got to third. Treacartin fanned the air, Cregan went out, Burns to Melish. Score--20.

Inning No. 3--McKee hit to short and that settled him. Weir hit a little pop infield fly, which took a "right about turn" feeling and rolled towards the grand stand.

"Pete" knows the rules and a foul was called. Ember kicked a little, but that is "Ned's" strong point. Weir then fouled again, but this time Dan captured it before the ball had a chance to roll. McGuigan hit one to pitcher, who handled it nicely, and Britt completed the out.

For the St. John's the fair-haired boy at second went out, Burns to first. Britt hit a grounder to second, who handled it artistically, and threw him out. Long hit to McKee and was out at first. Score 20.

Inning No. 4--There was something doing this half. Baler fled to left and Long and Harris collided, both being hurt for a time. Long, however, held on to the ball. Ember again knocked the sphere in the same place for two bases. Finnmore hit to centre and Cregan let it slip by. Ember scoring, and Finnmore reached third. G. Baler hit to McGuigan, who failed to catch the sprinter from the capital at the plate. Melish hit to centre and Baler got to third on the hit. McKee went out second to first. In the St. John's half Burke hit to centre, Breen fled to G. Baler in right garden and a good catch was made. The Baler boy also helped to double up on Burke who was off first. Harris got four wide ones. Mills hit to centre and Baler went out second to first. Treacartin fanned again.

Inning No. 5--Weir struck out. McKee got a bye and stole second. E. Baler struck out. Ember hit a sky-scraper to right and Breen helped him by dropping it. McGuigan scored on the drive. Finnmore hit a grounder to Long, who seemed not to be the same since the collision, and he fumbled it. Ember reaching third. G. Baler went out second to first. The St. John's started McKee got a life on first after a hard fly for Harris who failed to pinch it. Ember hit to short and McGuigan played "foxy pat" and spoiled Long's chance. Finnmore fled to Harris and the latter made a great throw home catching McKee. Burke caught Story on third but as the ball was not in play Story was given another chance on second. G. Baler ended the game by flying to the ball trap in left.
