are no longer needed to keep up wages," said Mr. Brierly. "Kansas cannot give laborers enough wages to get them to go out there and no free transpontation is offered. The big corporations, especially the railroads, pay from \$1.75 a day up and board the men well, besides transporting them to their destination free of charge."

In this plea from the governor of a great state and the answers given to it there is a first rate clew to the industrial situation in the west. As has been said in previous despatches to the Herald, there is no surplus of labor on which to draw. Hatherto for many summers Chicago has had a host of idle men on account of strikes. Complete adjustment during the last week of the freight handlers wage controversy with railroads has cleared the local industrial atmosphere and at the present time there are no indications of a serious strike this year.

This summer there have been more voluntary wage advances than for many years. Conciliation may be said to have taken the place of strikes to a great extent. There are a few labor complications in the city now, but they are the kind that do not interest the public greatly and cannot possibly inure to the benefit of Kansase.


