LLOYD GEORGE URGED TO QUIT LIBERAL RANKS

Former Premier, However, Sees Difficulties in Way

BREACH IS FINAL

Reconciliation of Former Premier With Asquith Considered Impossible

LONDON, May 28.—Personal friends and staunch supporters of Lloyd George are urging him to repudiate his enemies in the Liberal party and to form a new centre party appealing to the rank and file of Liberalism.

Lloyd George is undoubtedly attracted by the idea, but the difficulties in the way of its accomplishment are great. He still has control of the huge war fund accumulated while he was coalition Prime Minister, but the party machine is solidly in the hands of Asquith and his associates.

Possibly Lloyd George could capture this organization but it would mean a complete smashing up of the Liberal party and an entirely reorganization which would take much time.

SAY BREACH IS FINAL

Lloyd George's friends say that his breach with Asquith is final. It is impossible that they should ever become reconciled again, accordingly they urge that Lloyd George must command his own future if he would ever hope to return to any position of political power. Conservatives throughout the country regard Lloyd George's career as finished. They feel that he has no longer any force in politics and that he has done nothing but blunder since the war.

His defenders retort that Lloyd George will surprise them yet. One thing is certain that the whole country is keenly interested in his future.

COOLIDGE WELCOMES HEIR OF SWEDEN

Crown Prince and Wife Greeted at Washington—Comment on Country

WASHINGTON, May 28.—Sweden's heir apparent, Gustavus Adolphus, and the Crown Princess Louise, his wife, were welcomed last night as royal visitors to this country by the President and Mrs. Coolidge.

The welcome extended by the chief executive, coupled with the less formal honors bestowed upon the Crown Prince and Princess on their arrival early yesterday in New York caused them to express their gratitude for the "friendly welcome given us." The Prince spoke of the strangeness and newness of the things he saw, mentioning in particular, the "great city rising from the water like a phantom," the "unique architectural wonders," and the "vastness of it all."

BYRD REACHES GRAVESEND IN STMR. CHANTIER

Kentish Town Welcomes Second Man to Reach North Pole

EXPEDITION WELL

Commander Tells of Epoch-Making Flight in Interview With Reporters

GRAVESEND, Eng., May 28.—This town in Kent today had the honor of welcoming the second man who ever reached the North Pole. He is Lt. Commander Richard E. Byrd, United States Navy, who sailed into the Thames last night on the steamer Chantier from Spithead.

The steamer took the Byrd expedition to King's Bay and waited there for Byrd and his pilot, Chief Petty Officer Floyd Bennett, to negotiate the something like 1,400 miles over the frozen Arctic in the aeroplane Josephine Ford to the pole and back. The feat was accomplished Sunday, May 9, in about 15 1/2 hours.

ALL ARE WELL

To a correspondent of the London Daily Mail he said: "I felt very elated when assured by my compass and other reckonings that I was over the pole. I wrote a note to my companion (Bennett) to whom I could not speak owing to the noise of the engine, saying: 'We are at the pole.' He shook hands with me and smiled."

The expedition is returning to the United States. All on board the Chantier, except the pilot, Byrd, returned to the ship on Saturday. Byrd and his pilot, Chief Petty Officer Floyd Bennett, were landed at King's Bay. An hour before reaching the pole, we had a very bad oil leak on one engine, but Bennett and I decided to push on to the pole. I also had snow blindness in one eye. "The sun shone throughout the flight, which meant that I could use my sun compass the whole time. I am quite convinced we reached the pole."

VANCOUVER WILL HAVE NEW HOTEL

Vancover Business Men Backed By New York Capital in The Venture

VANCOUVER, B. C., May 28.—Construction in Vancouver of a \$500,000 hotel on land to be leased by the Canadian National Railway, will be commenced this year by a group of Vancouver business men aided by New York capital following completion of a modified agreement between the city and the C. N. R. It is announced by Mayor Louis D. Taylor.

The hotel to be erected in the downtown business section, will contain 316 rooms and be at least ten stories high.

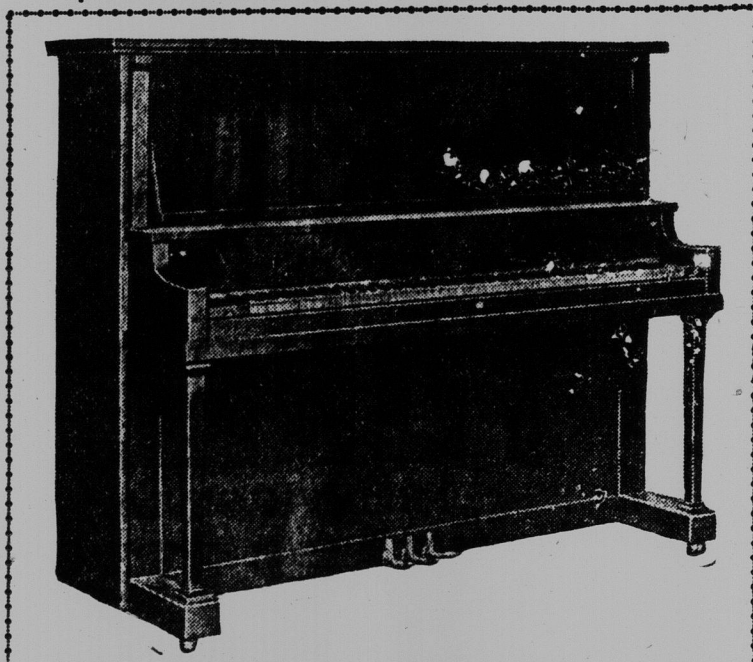

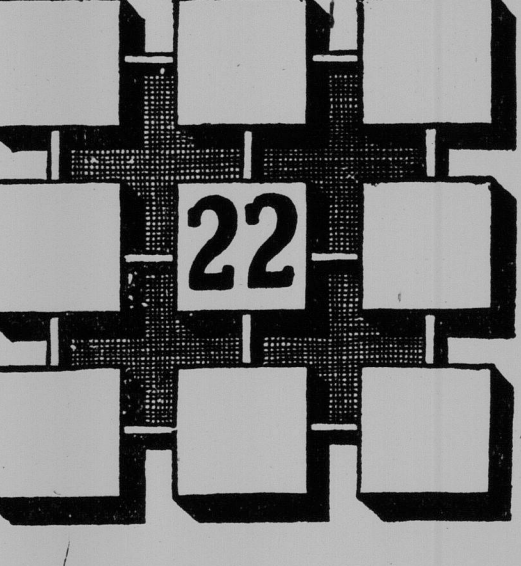
