and report. The president, A. M. Belding, suggested they might take up the
advisability of asking for the appointment of a Maritime superintendent of
neglected and delinquent children.

Mr. Belding was warmly welcomed
after his tour of the west. The monthly report of the agent showed that nine
children had been admitted on compassionate grounds. Of these, five had
been again taken out by their parents.
It was reported that two of the others
would soon be admitted to the Protestant orphanage and that the mother
of the others would soon be out of the
hospital and would be in a position to
take them home.
