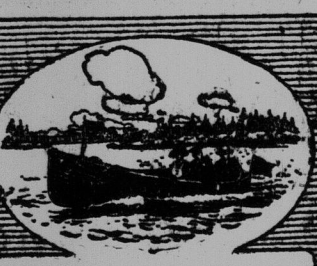

have been formed in schools in various
parts of the Dominion. Last year there
were fifty-five guide summer camps and
a larger number expected this year. Dur-
ing the year 2,888 badges for proficiency
were issued from headquarters, fifty-five
first class, 428 for thrift and forty-two
all round records.
