and the capital of most of the men in my position who consist solely of the hand-rea of two we receive as a gratuity, and that won't go very far in Canada, Australia or South Africa.

"I should prefer to make a career of the army, but so would thousands of other temporary officers, and it won't be possible for the War Office to keep us all. Many of us, as a result of our army experience, would be able to take positions as works managers or as supervisors of large staffs of men, but I doubt very much if there will be enough jobs of that kind to go around.

"No, I'm hanged if I know what I'm going to do afterwards. I know it will sour and sicken many an officer if, after having given the best years of his life to his country—the years when he should have been making a position for himself—he has eventually to go back to his old subordinate position and the clerk's stool. The thought of it is almost enough to make one hope that one to that other 'afterwards'."
