

Facts From The Annual Report of the Trust

MAJORITY TO TEACHING

The Law Comes Next - Believe End Aimed at by Great Founder is Being Achieved — Fair Record Made in Honors

(Times' Special Correspondence)
London Feb. 24—The "Times" says:
One of the most interesting features in the annual report, just issued, of the Rhodes Scholarship Trust for the academic year 1911-1912 is the list given at the end of the report which indicates the lines of work taken up by scholars who have completed their Oxford course and returned to their own countries during the last six years. The outstanding feature of this list is the very large proportion of exscholars who enter upon educational and legal careers. Of the former there are 123 and of the latter eighty-four. Next in order numerically are those who have entered the civil, diplomatic, or consular services in various parts of the empire, in the United States, and in Germany, of whom, grouped together, there are thirty-three. Of the others included in the list twenty have given themselves to religious work, fifteen to medicine, fourteen to business, eight to mining and engineering and five each to journalism, agriculture and forestry.


