

TWELVE MONTHS HARD LABOR FOR POLICEMAN

Yielded to Temptation on Finding Store Door Open at Night and Took Watch

Ernest Granger, aged 25, a police constable of St. John, Eng., was charged with burglariously entering the confectionery shop of Thomas Middlehurst and stealing a gold watch. Kidnapped Riley, for the prosecution, said that on the night of November 9 Mr. Middlehurst himself locked his shop door before going to bed. A little after one o'clock on the following morning he heard a knocking below and on going downstairs found Granger, in his uniform, with his lantern shining. Granger told him he had found that the premises were not secured and then went away. Next morning Mr. Middlehurst missed a gold watch. Subsequently Granger was charged by a superior officer and after denying that he had any knowledge of the watch took an inspector to his house and produced the watch from a waistcoat pocket, saying: "I found the premises insecure and had to rouse the occupants of it. I saw the watch lying on the sideboard and yielded to a sudden temptation."

In cross-examination, Mr. Middlehurst admitted that the door of the shop had been locked by merely closing it, and that he might have told the prisoner before the magistrate that he "thought" he had fastened the door but the lock was "a faulty one and liable to slip." It was true he had been aroused once or twice before in the night by the police because the door was open.

The accused, giving evidence, on oath, said that he had been on the police force three and a half years. Before that he was a Coldstream Guards, and earlier still a clerk in the Army and Navy Stores. It was not true that he forced

DOUGLAS AVENUE CHURCH EVANGELISTIC SERVICES

The congregations at the evangelistic meetings conducted by Evangelist Lowell C. McPherson in the Douglas Avenue Christian church are trying the capacity of the building. The meetings will continue over next Sunday. Last evening Mr. McPherson preached on "Christian Self-Respect." Reading from Acts 21 he accounted of the Apostle Paul's arrest. Mr. McPherson said in part:

"If ever a true, brave, wide-brimmed, great-hearted man lived on this earth he was Paul, the Apostle of Our Lord. Paul never forgot his great commission until they have to do with their fellow men. Then they prove their little ones. Not so, Paul."

"Friends we must respect ourselves in that high sense of being conscientious and being open to the knowledge of the truth. Again we should respect our families. Marriage is honorable in all. Friendship is a sacred trust. Friends should be sincere and just. Honesty befits them." The man who deserves not friends is a failure. Does he not respect himself by respecting his friends?

"I get him," he said as he laid him down. An' that was all he said. Fer without a nap he swayed a bit An' fell in a huddle, dead; So we took him up on the rattlin' cage, An' we buried him down on the flat, An' I reckon his soul is up above Where the souls of the brave are at.

Boiled Cod, Cream Sauce
