The Potato Market,

(Fredericton Gleaner.)

Whenever the free entry of potatoes to the markets of the United States becomes a reality, if it does, he looks for a price which will cause a more active market locally. Some time ago it was announced that potatoes would be given a free entry to fine United States markets, but it has not yet materialized. When it does come about local dealers will be able to grant, the farmers more than they are now able to pay.

The Boston market is today supplied largely by the Michigan and Wisconsin spuds, which are landed there much more cheaply than they can be landed either from Maine or New Brunswick. This very naturally helps to keep our prices down. Dealers here cannot pay more than \$2.25 to \$2.50 per barrel, which is not inviting to farmers of this section. Local shippers say they would gladly pay more if the outside markets encouraged it, but they do not.
