### ing age would be the era of gas. Gas would be the principal means of transportation, communication and industry, and the future of the business of manufacturing gas was assured. Everybody in connection with the business knew that coal should not be burned raw, but the question was how to avoid this, and the soot and other discomforts that came from it. It was a big question, but it would be solved, as had other big questions about which there was much doubt.

Mr. Parsons referred to the use of oxygen in industry today, and the rapid advances that had been made with it, and said they had only begun to understand what could be done with it.

The first great thing was to find a cheaper means of production, and then they would begin to revolutionize present methods. That gas was fuel would be the fuel of the future he had not the slightest doubt, as, with the development of the use of oxygen would come the development of the use of other gases whose use is not now commercially possible.

The delegates were welcomed to the city by Mayor Copley, who said he hoped their two-day stay here would be pleasant and profitable. President E. C. Baeg of Montreal gave his annual address during the morning, and referred to the rapid development of the association.
