two hundred and fourteen new books have been added to it. The cast-off books were divided equally between the Mimico Industrial School and the Fort Pelly Indian Mission School.

The collections for missionary purposes amounted to \$247.37, which is \$24.42 less than was raised in 1893. Besides the foregoing three classes of girls gave special collections which amounted to \$16.30, which makes the total raised for missions \$263.67.

The senior class of boys contributed an average of 90 cents per Sabbath. We commend their example to the rest of the School.

The following distribution has been made of the money: Foreign Missions, \$50.00; Home Missions, \$85.00, allocated as follows: Provincial S. S. Association, \$10.00; Rocky Mountain Valley Mission, \$25.00; General Fund, \$35.00; London West, \$15.00; Augmentation Fund, \$25.00; Pointe Aux Trembles, \$50.00; Pointe Aux Trembles, special, \$25.00; French Evangelization, \$10.00; Welland Canal Mission, \$5.00; Welland Canal Mission, special, \$10.00.
