ART IN ST. JOHN.

Yesterday many hundreds of our citizens visited the exhibition of the school in connection with the Drawing Art Institute, to view the work done by the pupils during the past term. The exhibit was a large one, and included oils, water colors, and crayons, the oils being the most numerous, and while the pictures were of very unequal merit as works of art, yet many of them were of a high order of artistic taste and feeling, and also an inconsiderable amount of artistic ability.

THE HARBOUR COMMISSION.

Now that the proposed Harvey Salisbury line project is disposed of, and the outside enemies of St. John have been defeated, it is time for our people to consider their position with reference to the question of placing the harbor in commission. On the 15th May St. John and Portland will become one city, and by a resolution of the council a vote of the citizens of St. John is to be taken on the harbor commission question on the 21st.

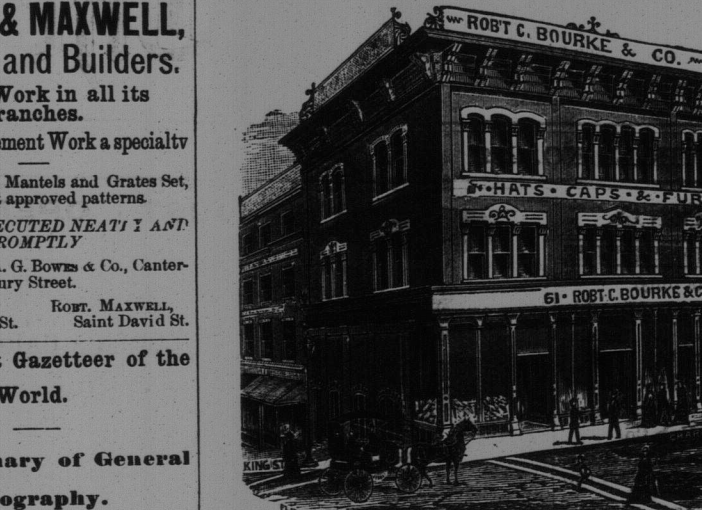

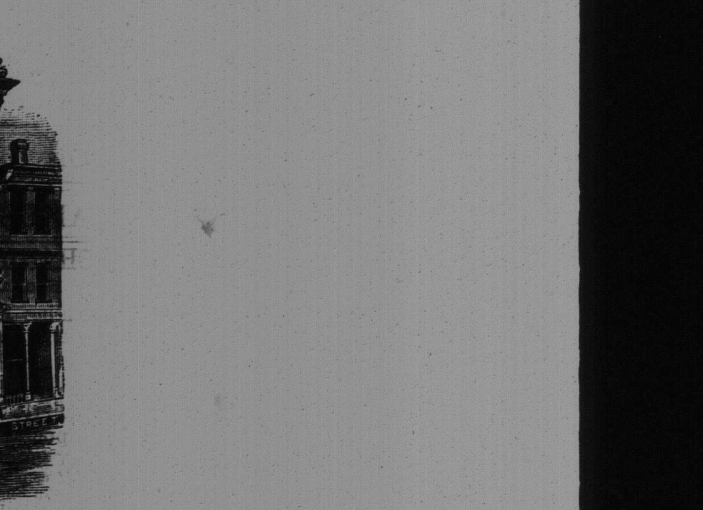
