COMMISSIONER:

- Q Do you know your father's signature, do you know his writing, do you know whether that is his writing or not?
- A. I could not really say.
- Q. Your father's name was Thomas Truthwaite, Sr, was it?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Do you know whether he ever made a claim to this lot or not?
- A. I fancy he did. I would not be certain.
- Q. That is a claim on the Dominion Government?
- A. Yes, I would not be certain but I fancy he did.
- Q. I show you what purports to be a Statutory Declaration of Thomas Truthwaite, Sr. in file 140163, do you know whether that is your father's signature at the bottom of the declaration, or not?
- A. No, I do not. I could not say.

MR HEAP:

- Q. When did your father die?
- A. About six years agon I think in July, 13th of July.
- Q. Did your father cut any wood on this land?
- A. Oh yes, lots of it.
- Q. He did cut wood? A. Yes.
- Q. Did you cut any wood?
- A. Well, I hauled it. Generally hired a man to cut it and we hauled it in.
- Q. Now what years would that be? A. In '70 or '71, sometime.
- Q. Would it be in these winters that you have spoken of?
- A. Yes, during that time.
- Q. How many cords did you cut off it, give us an idea?
- A. I cannot tell you, we were cutting all the time.
- Q. Did you cut five cords or fifty?
- A. More than five.
- Q. More than fifty? A. more than fifty, even. Well, then we took building wood off.
