SYDNEY.

Sydney, N. S., Aug. 14.—(Special)—The Dominion Packing Company, Charlottetown (P. E. I.), capitalized \$1,000,000. The company is also negotiating for property near the I. C. R. where they propose erecting a cold storage plant. The business at Sydney will be carried on an extensive scale and will include everything within range of estates. Today's output of coal at Dominion No. 1 was 226 tons. This beats the record at this mine since the flooding. It is expected that 500 tons a day will be raised by the end of the month. There are now 20 pairs of men at work in the mine, and it is expected that the mine will be able to produce more coal than the water than was expected. The Eastern Telephone Company has decided to run a cable across the Strait of Canso from Hantsport to Mulgrave and to extend its line from Mulgrave to Halifax. It will then be in a position to give a long distance service from one end of the province to the other.
