The celebration of RCMP history will not end in 1998. In 1999, the Force will mark the 125th anniversary of the March West, establishing frontier posts and initiating friendly relations with the aboriginal people.

The reenactment of the monumental March West will take place in the summer of 1999 beginning in Emerson, Manitoba, and will continue until the riders reach Fort Macleod, Alberta. A core group of 50 riders will travel across Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta and will pick up hundreds of volunteers for short rides along the way. This commemoration will highlight the RCMP's historic role of maintaining order in cooperation with local communities. This will be a great undertaking and a lot of fun for the people involved.
