Dr. Edward's Moved: National Schools

DISCUSSION COMES TO AN END WITHOUT ANY ACTION BEING TAKEN

Ottawa May 14.-A debate on the question of national schools was precipitated in the House to-day by Dr. Edwards member for Frontenac.

Dr. Edwards had a motion on the order paper calling for the establishment of a national school system but it was not reached before private members' days were abolished for the session so he started to discussion to-day on the motion to go into supply. The debate which ensued was at times inclined to be heated, and R.H. Butts, as a mark of disapproval walked out of the House during the course of Dr. Edwards' speech.

A statement by Dr. Edwards that there were whole counties in Ontario and Quebec where no provision is made for the education of children of the minority drew forth denials from Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux and Mr. J.A. Robb, Well Satisfied.

As a representative Protestant of Quebec Province Mr. Robb stated that he was well satisfied with educational conditions in that province.

Mr. Lemieux declared his belief that separate schools with religious instruction were the best for Canada.

Dr. R.K. Anderson of Halifax expressed a contrary view. He declared that there is a growing desire throughout the world for non-sectarian schools. Support for the national schools proposal also came from Mr. Munk of East Edmonton.

H.C. Hoekin complimented Dr. Edwards for bringing up the matter and praised the Norris Government of Manitoba for its handling of the separate school question. He said that it was the duty of Parliament to see that national schools sentiment is created in Canada.

When Mr. Hoekin concluded the debate petered out and the House went into committee of supply.

Mileage Rates For Distance Calls

PLAN TO BE ADOPTED BY BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY

Montreal May 14.-Following the judgment delivered in Ottawa yesterday telephone rates will be increased within one week according to a statement by C.F. Sise vice-president and general manager of the Bell Telephone Company.

The cost of all telephones under rental will be advanced 10 per cent., and toll rates estimated on a basis of mileage rates will increase about nine per cent. The latter increase however, is not a flat rate for the mileage system of tolls will decrease some charges and advance others.

When the quarterly statement is sent to telephone subscribers on July 1 they will find a charge for adjustment to cover the period from the time when the new rates take effect (in one week) to that date.

Thereafter charges will be computed quarterly on the new rates.

Austrian Envoys Arrive at Paris

DELEGATES MOST COURTEOUS

PARIS, May 14.-The Austrian peace envoys arrived at Versailles to-day on a special train and were formally received by representatives of the allies.

The first meeting with the Austrian delegates presented a sharp contrast to the first meeting because of its greater ease and friendliness.

The party was headed by Karl Renner, the chancellor. He appeared in the doorway of the car with his hat in his hand and with a contagious smile that put the reception committee quickly at its ease.

No Handshaking
Dr. Renner, a plump, round-faced man with a black beard and bald head and with his eyes shining brightly behind a pair of gold-rimmed spectacles, bowed courteously to the reception committee. There was no handshaking.

The head of the Austrian party was followed by Dr. Franz Klein, Peter Eichhoff and Dr. Richard Schuller. After them came the other members of the delegation, which numbered about 60.

VIENNA, May 12.-"You must remember that as a vanquished state we must not cherish too great hopes," said Chancellor Karl Renner, chief of the Austrian peace commission, on leaving this city to-night for Paris. He added that he would try to obtain the best terms possible. The train pulled out amid cries from the crowd: "We are determined Germans and shall remain Germans. We want union with the German Empire."
