DESTROYING MUSTARD

Prof. Todd of the Provincial Sec retary's Department, who is superintending the agricultural work at the Guelph and Whitby farms, reports an experiment recently tried to rid the land of wild mustard. A place comprising one hundred acres was selected near Brockville this summer which was sown in barley and oats. The land was sprayed with a diluted solution of sulphate of copper. After a few weeks had elapsed an ex amination was made, and Prof. Todd reports that every trace of the wild unstard had disappeared. To test the value of this treatment other sections of the Province will be

selected next year and the same method applied, in the hope of ridding the entire agricultural district ot this weed pest.

The result of the Brockville test is not generally known in this section and a treatment of one of the many fields near Athens infested with the weed would be watched with interest.
