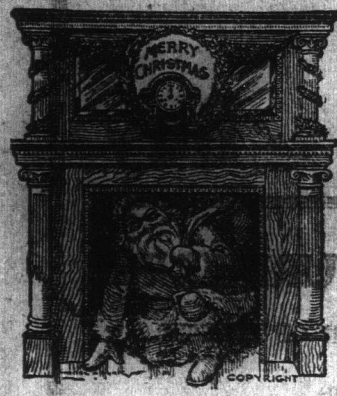

The Medicine Hat Agricultural Society holds its First Annual Seed Fair in the City Hall on Tuesday, Feb. 5th. The objects of the fair will be commercial and educational. Those having good seed will be able to sell it, and those wanting it, to buy it. Addresses will be given during the afternoon by speakers supplied by the Seed Branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture. The subjects will be good seed, weeds, smut, etc.

Lost in a Blizzard.

Two Men Have an Experience—Horses Nearly Frozen.

On the night of Thursday, the ninth of January, two employees of Davis & McMillan, successors to E. J. Lightbody had an experience they will never forget and one which came very near to ending their lives. P. Foreman and W. Hinson were drawing in two loads of hay on runners, and had come to within 45 miles of Medicine Hat, when the blizzard came up. The depth of the snow blocked the road, and the horses could draw the loads no further.

HULES GOVERNING SEED FAIR.

1. All seed entered for competition must have been grown by the exhibitor in the year 1904.
2. No seed shall be admitted for competition for prizes unless the quantities of seed for sale, as per sample exhibited, are at least 30 bushels of wheat, 30 bushels of oats, 20 bushels of barley, 5 bushels of peas, flax, prairie grass seed or rye grass seed, 3 bushels of timothy and 1 bushel of clover seed.
3. In classes 1 to 7 inclusive, two bushels of seed shall be shown, in classes 8 to 12, one bushel. All exhibits of seed shall be laid to be representative of the total quantity of such seed offered for sale by the exhibitor.
4. No premiums shall be awarded on exhibits that contain impurities which in the opinion of the judge, are of a noxious nature.
5. No exhibitor shall receive more than one prize in any class.
6. All samples of seed must be labelled after judging, with the name and address of the exhibitor, the
